MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

Dear North Beach Residents,

Here we are again at the beginning of another warm weather season at the beach! The town staff, along with resident volunteers, have planned numerous events from May to October for your enjoyment. While many, such as the Farmers' Market, Classic Car Cruise-In and Art Fair, are on a recurring basis because of their popularity, I would like to call your attention to two very special events. First, on June 18th, will be the 4th Annual Dragon Boat Festival to benefit the Calvert End Hunger program. This race day is scheduled to grow larger this year with 42 entries and even more participants than last year. Come out, enjoy a day watching races on the Bay and help support the End Hunger program that serves some of Calvert's needlest citizens.

There will be a new twist this July to the Eat, Drink, Go Local event sponsored by the Maryland Wineries Association. They are returning to North Beach for the sixth consecutive year and this time will be in conjunction with SUNRISE: A Celebration of the Arts. The town will be hosting an Art Festival and Sculpture Competition at the Sunrise Garden on the corner of 3rd Street and Bay Avenue. Local artists will be competing for prizes and to have their sculptures displayed in the park for one year (until the same event next year).

As far as capital projects are concerned, work is proceeding on the construction of a flood dike behind the residences on Atlantic and Bay Avenues north of 9th Street. This area of North Beach has been, and will continue to be, threatened by an increasing number of flooding events as we experience a gradual rise in sea levels.

Another public works project involves new sidewalks, curbing, asphalt resurfacing and storm water management improvements on Dayton Avenue between 5th and 7th Streets.

I'd like to welcome former councilmember Jane Hagen to this council, filling the unexpired term of Greg McNeil. Jane was elected by the council members to fill the vacancy when Greg moved outside the town limits. Best wishes to both Jane and Greg!

Hall to obtain a seasonal pass or present your identification at the Welcome Center for a day pass. Your guests, who will be free, must be with you at the time of check in at the Welcome Center. Why not take advantage of this special "town perk" while you can. The Town Attendants are waiting to serve you.

North Beach is definitely the place to be on Friday evenings during the spring and summer season. There will be music, whether it be a DJ or a live band, every Friday evening for the Farmers' Market, Art Fair and Classic Car Cruise -In. The popular market is sure to bring everyone out of their winter blues and this rain-soaked spring! While you enjoy a campfire on the beach every other

Friday, children can take part in some crafting fun. Each craft night has a theme and the kids love taking home their beachy creations.

Every month from May through October, there will be a movie on the beach or a drive-in movie in the parking lot. These family-friendly movies are always on Saturday evenings and are always FREE! Stay in town for your



dinner and movie date. We hear there are a few places to get some good popcorn and candy to enjoy during the movie!

SCOOP THE POOP

Help stop pointless poo-llution! When you fail to pick up after your pooch, you may be doing more than upsetting the many residents and visitors to our Town. A quick rain shower is all it takes to transfer dog droppings from the ground and into the Chesapeake Bay.

We've added more mutt-mitt stations for easy access in five convenient locations. One station is at the corner of 9th and Atlantic, two stations at Overlook Park and

two stations at the entrances to Callis Park. This brings our count to 14 mutt-mitt stations along the waterfront, at Overlook Park and locations used by pet owners throughout the Town. See the park attendant at Sunrise Garden for mutt-mitts.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS (DPW) UPDATE

The town is continuing to improve streets and sidewalks throughout North Beach. Currently, new curb and sidewalks are being added on the west side of Dayton Avenue from 5th Street to 7th Street. This will provide safer travel for pedestrians in this area. Improvements will also greatly help with storm water issues.

With spring in full swing, a lot of residents are outside enjoying the warmer weather. Residents are busy with spring yard cleanup and tasks that normally happen this time of the year. Please remember to bag all leaves and yard debris for pick up by the town's trash contractor on regular trash collection days. Call Town Hall to schedule for any bulk items that need to be removed. Thank you for continually being courteous to your neighbor with general yard maintenance.

With spring also brings the chance of severe storms for this area from time to time. Please make sure you and your home are prepared with basic items for these events. In the event of emergency situations, these important contact numbers may be needed: Town Hall 301.855.6681; Calvert Control Center (after normal business hours) 410.535.3491; BGE 1.877.778.2222.

The town received bids for the dredging of the boat slips located on the town pier. The contract was awarded to the low bid contractor, Dissen & Juhn Company. The pre-construction meeting has been set for May 17 and work is expected to proceed shortly thereafter. The dredging will provide the proper depth for boats to be able to dock at the town pier and visitors to come by water to see what the North Beach has to offer.

Stop by and visit the Sunrise Garden, located at the corner of 3rd Street and Bay Avenue. As we are approaching the one year mark of the park opening, it is really starting to be a favorite spot in town. With the koi fish, art sculptures and lush landscaping, it makes for a peaceful area to enjoy the outdoors.

TOWN PRIDE AND BEAUTIFICATION

The Town of North Beach is constantly working to improve the appearance of the Town for its visitors and residents. Doing so helps maintain and improve property values. Studies show it can also have a positive impact in deterring crime. The Town is maintained in a manner that is aesthetically pleasing for its residents and visitors, while keeping the Town's character and charm intact. It is vital that the citizens take an active role in this endeavor. Below is a small list of things that can contribute to this effort.

- . keeping trash cans screened from public view
- . keeping grass and shrubs cut and trimmed properly
- . avoiding an overaccumulation of trash, debris, or equipment
- properly maintaining the paint and roofing on your home
- properly maintaining fences and sheds

In addition to these items, the Town has collaborated with Friendship Community Baptist Church for a project called "Love Thy Neighbor Week." This effort will take place July 10-17, 2016. The church and its volunteers will be providing labor and materials (free of charge) to help some of our disadvantaged citizens with necessary home repairs.


PREPARE ME CALVERT MOBILE APP

The "Prepare Me Calvert" mobile app is a must-have app for emergency preparedness and information. It puts critical, real-time information at users' fingertips in the unlikely event of a regional emergency and helps residents stay prepared. Citizens are encouraged to download "Prepare Me Calvert" now for iOS (Apple) and Android devices for free through the Apple App Store or the Google Play market.

Some of the many features of the app include:

- . Alerts for actual emergencies that scroll across the screen
- A weather section providing information based on users'

geographical locations along with guidance on how to respond to the weather conditions



- An "I'm OK" feature allowing users to send messages to loved ones when phone systems are clogged in an emergency—letting them know their status during an emergency
- A "Where Am I" feature that can send the user's exact location to any

recipient via text, email, Facebook or Twitter

 A sign-up area for people to register themselves if they, or a loved one, have special needs, want to sign up to receive Calvert County ALERTs or who wish to join the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT)

CALVERT COUNTY ALERT

Residents can also sign up for Calvert County ALERT to receive timely information about various emergency and non-emergency situations in the county. Calvert County ALERT messages can be sent to individuals using a variety of contact methods — cell phone, landline, email, text messaging, fax, pager and more — ensuring that

residents and county staff can receive life-saving emergency information and important public service announcements in

minutes. More than one of each device can be registered. The system allows the county to target specific geographic areas for alerts or send alerts countywide. It can also gather information on citizens with special needs who may need additional help in an emergency and receive feedback on important questions.

Dogs Running

AT LARGE

Please be reminded that Article II Dogs, Section 26-3 of the code of the Town of North Beach states that no person shall own or harbor within the Town of North Beach any dog unless such dog is licensed as provided by the ordinances and regulations of Calvert County. All ordinances and regulations of Calvert County concerning dogs shall apply within the corporate limits of the Town of North Beach. In addition, this includes the provisions of the Calvert County Code which call for all dogs to be on a leash when in the company of their owner outside the confines of the owner's property. In addition, it is expressly prohibited for any dog to be on the town beach, whether said dog be at large or on a leash. It is the intention of the Council that dogs are prohibited on the sand beach under all circumstances.

Additionally, Section 26-7, Enforcement, states that the Mayor, Town Code Enforcement Officer, Deputies of the Calvert County Sheriff's Department, and Dog Wardens of Calvert County shall have jurisdiction within the corporate limits of North Beach to enforce all provisions of this article. Section 26-8, Violations and penalties


states that violations of this article shall be a municipal infraction.



SUNRISE GARDEN

Sunrise Garden is open year-round, dawn to dusk. We ask that you please observe these general park rules to ensure everyone's visit is pleasant!

- No person or animal is allowed in the ponds or water features.
- No recreational motorized scooters, bicycles, skates, skateboards or rollerblades are allowed in park area.
- No family events or group activities allowed without a Town permit.
- This is a DRUG-FREE, ALCOHOL-FREE and TOBACCO-FREE zone.



- Pets must be on a leash.
- No amplified music is allowed.
- No picnicking allowed.
- . No tents or tent-like structures are allowed.
- . Grilling and/or open flames are not permitted.
- . Do not feed the wildlife.
- . No loitering.

TRASH TALK

Is your trash in a bag inside a trash can with a lid? Did you know you are required to have all trash placed in a bag and then in an acceptable trash container with a secure lid? In other words, don't leave your items out in

plastic bags alone sea gulls, crows, squirrels and other critters love to get in their contents! Be respectful of the environment, the community and your neighbors and place all trash in a bag inside a secure trash receptacle. After your trash has been picked up please remove your

trash can from the

right-of-way as soon as possible. In addition:

- . All trash/bulk/recyclables must be curbside by 6 a.m.
- Trash must be bagged, placed in a

trash can with a lid.

- . Trash cans shall have a functioning lid and must be stored out of sight on non-trash days.
- Recyclables must be in a container

clearly marked "recycling" container.

. Bulk trash pickup is on a once-amonth basis, by appointment only.

Do not place bulk items out until the night before scheduled pickup. Call Town Hall (301.855.6681) by the Friday prior to the monthly pickup date to schedule an appointment for your bulk trash pickup.



Please note that tires are not considered bulk trash. If you have tires to dispose of, please contact Calvert County Solid Waste and Recycling Division at 410.326.0210.

BAYSIDE HISTORY MUSEUM: A TRUE COMMUNITY EFFORT



When visitors come to the Bayside History Museum, they are always amazed at the variety of exhibits and displays. Even though there are countless tags depicting the donations from people far and wide, it is our local community that really supports us, starting with the Town of North Beach.

A first time visitor is curious, but as time goes on we see familiar faces returning with their friends and neighbors. Parents come to bring their children to participate in children's programs, lectures, boy scouts, girl scouts and scavenger hunts. All leave happy.

This would not be possible without the generosity of many, but we would like to talk about our newest exhibits and what made them possible.

The History of Motorcycles exhibit, slated to open July 4th weekend, would not be possible without Tan's Cycles. Tommy Crockett allowed the museum to copy more than twenty years of photos and records, which will make this an interesting exhibit. Our two college employees, Vincent Turner and Tori George, worked day in and day out scanning and putting all these records into our Past Perfect Museum Software database.



The picture shown, and more than 900+ other photos, newspaper articles, and pictures have made it possible for the museum to create an exhibit dedicated to our Twin Beach Players. Thank you Sid Curl for making this possible. That exhibit opens Memorial Day weekend.

Our continuing "Day at the Beach" exhibit has added a component depicting the Native American Indian day at the beach featuring a 500 pound dug out (made and donated by Peter Vogt).

AND, one of the favorite exhibits simply called "THE COTTAGE" appeals to young and old alike. Children who visit the museum for one of its programs can hardly believe a time that there were no televisions, telephones,

bathrooms, washing machines, or microwaves. They love to take selfies with their favorite object.

We hosted a Camp Roosevelt Scout Master and staff reunion last fall which drew visitors from Hawaii, California, Florida, and New Hampshire. Each former Scout Master brought their memorabilia from their days at Camp Roosevelt and donated it to the Museum. We purchased two new display cases just to display all the new scouting artifacts.

We are open Wednesday through Sunday from I to 4 p.m. Please stop by - we look forward to your visit!

AWARD RULES

- The Committee will select one home each month within the incorporated Town of North Beach.
- The committee will judge only the portion of yard viewed from the street.
- The Yard of the Month program will start in May and end in October.
- 4. Judging will take place the 15th of the month.
- The winner will be announced at a Town Council meeting, as well as displayed on town marquee.
- The Committee will place a Yard
 of the Month sign in each winning
 yard for the month.
- 7. Each resident may nominate any yard and landscape with the town, including their own.
- Each yard may only win the Yard of the Month award once in a calendar year.

WINNING

The judges will use the following criteria when choosing a **Yard of the Month**. These are only guidelines and the committee will make a final decision based on the residents obvious display of pride.

- Yard is attractive and well groomed; pleasing to eye (e.g. well kept lawn, a variety of plants such as trees, shrubs, ground cover, flowers/plants with a variety of heights, textures and colors, landscape features such as fountains, large rocks in beds, etc.)
- Buildings, fences, porches and patios on the property are in good repair (e.g. minimal distraction from the landscape due to deterioration, damage or construction)
- Extra consideration may be given to properties that have shown extra effort through the use of art pieces (e.g. pottery, ironwork), potted plants, birdhouses, patio or lawn furniture, windsocks, etc.
- Yard is free of litter, junk and debris (including inoperable or junked motor vehicles)
- . House numbers are displayed attractively
- Does a passerby sense that the homeowner has pride in his or her landscape and property

WINNERS WILL RECEIVE

A specially designed **Yard of the Month** sign placed in the winning front yard for one month.



NORTH BEACH NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH: IF YOU SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING

(NBNW) is accomplishing great things, thanks to you, the residents of North Beach. What is NBNW? The NBNW is the residents of the town, looking out for each other and the town. Our motto: if you see something, say something. Our deputies would prefer to get the call and have it turn out to be nothing, rather than not get the call and have it be something that could have been prevented or stopped. We have deputies dedicated to the beach, 24/7, however, they cannot be everywhere. This is where you come in, and again, simply said, if you see something, say something. Do not hesitate, make the call! We do not hold monthly meetings, however, we do attend the Town Council meetings which are held the second Thursday of every month. The meeting offers a time for public comment. In this way, we can share any concerns with the entire Town Council, as well as our police officers who are always in attendance. If you prefer, we would be happy to talk with you privately after the meeting or send your thoughts, ideas, or concerns to us via email at any time. If we are unable to assist through Neighborhood Watch, we will do our best to direct you to the appropriate town personnel.

The North Beach Neighborhood Watch

We have a monthly newsletter that is filled with information regarding what's going on around town; tips to keep you, your family, and property safe; and a copy of the monthly Sheriff's report. Unless an emergency situation arises in the beach, this will be the only email you receive. In addition, the email is sent under "blind carbon copy" so we are not sharing your email address with anyone. To add your name to the email list, send an email to northbeachnw@gmail.com.

Tip of the month: Take steps to avoid "Identity Theft" by shredding documents that contain your personal information

and/or account information. Calvert County offers FREE shred events every month. For a list of dates, go to www.co.cal.md.us/residents/waste/ recycling/. In addition, never give your personal information to anyone on an incoming phone call. Remember, institutions where you do business already have your information. If they tell you they want to verify, have them read to you what they have. If they give you incorrect information, do not give them your correct information, simply tell them the information is not correct. Always ask for the full name of the person calling and a call back number before sharing ANY information. ALL valid companies will readily give this information to you upon request. Check the number online to confirm it is a valid call and is going to the company indicated. Then, call the company back. When in doubt, don't give any information out!
