QAPP Frequently Asked Questions

What is a QAPP?

A QAPP is a Quality Assurance Project Plan. Per EPA document QA/R-5, the QAPP "documents how quality assurance (QA) and quality control (QC) are applied to an environmental data operation to assure that the results obtained are of the type and quality needed and expected."

When is a QAPP required?

A QAPP must be developed and approved by the EPA for all projects that involve environmental data collection, such as direct measurements, data collection from other sources, or data compilation from computerized databases and information systems. Social data, such as data collected through surveys, is also included.

When should the QAPP be developed and submitted?

A QAPP should be submitted to the EPA Chesapeake Bay Program 45 days PRIOR to any data collection or data compilation activity. The 45 days allows for required reviews by both the Bay Program and EPA Region 3.

What do I need to submit?

All QAPP packages must include the QAPP draft, checklist, and signature page. The checklist and signature page templates will be provided to you by DNR. All documents should be Word files or flat PDFs to allow for the inclusion of additional signatures.

How do I submit my QAPP?
