WORK AROUND TOWN

MD Rt. 261, between the Calvert County/Anne Arundel County line, is closed to through traffic for the roadway reconstruction project. This MDOT SHA project closure is expected to last 20 weeks. It is recommended that motorists prepare in advance to follow the detour signs and to allow additional time for your travels. As project updates are received from MDOT SHA, the Town of North Beach will continue to share with the public via email blast, town website and social media. Residents may also follow the Maryland Department of Transportation State Highway Administration project portal at www.roads.maryland.gov.

FALL COMMUNITY CLEAN UP

The Fall Community Clean Up will be Saturday and Sunday, September 26 and 27 from 8 am to 4 pm each day in the

commuter parking lot located at the northeastern corner of 5th Street and Chesapeake Avenue. The Town of North Beach will provide dumpsters for residents to dispose of all items EXCEPT hazardous materials, flammables, chemicals and household trash. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, you must adhere to the following guidelines:

- WEAR A MASK
- UNLOAD & DISPOSE OF OWN ITEMS
- PRACTICE PHYSICAL DISTANCING

Residents must show proof of identification.

EVERY VOTE COUNTS

There are two ways Calvert County residents can vote in the November 3rd general election:

- BY MAIL (All eligible, active voters should have received a mail in ballot application. If a voter wishes to vote by mail, please return the application as soon as possible. The deadline to receive the application (not just mailed by) is October 20. You may request a mail in ballot online or download the application.)
- IN PERSON (Five vote centers will be available on Election Day, and will include the four local high schools and the Community Resources Building [pending final approval]. Early Voting: Monday, October 26 through Monday, November 2; 7 am to 8 pm at Community Resources Building, Conference Room 1 - Lower Level, 30 Duke Street, Prince Frederick)
