



3rd Annual North Beach American Film Festival Brings the Stars to North Beach

North Beach, Maryland, June 6, 2019: The NBAFF showcases the best in American Independent Film, spotlighting films that exhibit the multi-cultural and diverse aspects of American life. The festival will have its 3rd annual event June 21-23, 2019 in the beautiful town of North Beach, Maryland. The event will hold eight screening blocks, complete with two special presentation waterfront screenings at sunset as well as filmmaker Q&A's and an awards ceremony.

On Friday, June 21, 2019 from 6 to 8 pm, there will be a Filmmaker's Welcome Reception and Meet & Greet at the Bayside History Museum, 4025 4th Street, North Beach, MD. At 8 pm, there will be Opening Night Waterfront Screenings with Family Medicine, The Healing of Harmon, Summer Hill, Five O'Clock Shadow, and Easy As Pie.







Chipped: Set in 1987, this sci-fi follows a family in Pittsburgh connected to a biotech company called DreamVision that bridges the gap between reality and the imaginary. The film follows a young mute named Tim, who was a test subject for DreamVision, as he begins to understand and develop his unique abilities.

Farming A Legacy: Farming A Legacy is about black farmers in Calvert County who have survived for generations against incredible odds, acquired and accumulated land, and have found ways to continue a family farming legacy born on the backs of their slave ancestors.

Summer Hill: The teenagers of a rural town are confronted by the not-so-charming realities of their hometown on the eve of its annual beauty pageant.

On Saturday, June 22, 2019 there will be numerous film screenings at Town Hall, 8916 Chesapeake Avenue, North Beach. The day starts at 10 am with 21 Years - A Folded Flag. The rest of the Saturday's schedule is as follows: 12:30 pm - John Hemmer & The Showgirls with Paradise Boogie; 3 pm - Crownsville Hospital: From Lunacy to Legacy; 5:30 pm - We Are Now with Dear Rosalynn. At the waterfront at 8 pm, there will be screenings of Take Me to the Stars, Chipped, Under the Same Sun, Sac De Merde, and Murder House.

On Sunday, June 23, 2019, the day will start at 11 am with brunch at Town Hall for the Filmmaker's Awards. At 1:30 pm, there is a screening of Dandelion Wine with Under the Same Sun (encore) at Chesapeake's Bounty, 9124 Bay Avenue, North Beach. For the final movie screening, Code & Response with Farming A Legacy will be at Town Hall at 2:30 pm.

The NBAFF Festival Pass for \$75 grants you access to all screenings and events during the 3rd Annual North Beach American Film Festival. The pass includes admission to all 8 screenings,

admission to the filmmaker's meet and greet with light refreshments and drinks, admission to the filmmaker awards brunch and a special gift bag for purchasers.
