The following is a list of items the Public Works Department has been working on in addition to routine task.

- 1) Update on streetscape project- Hard scape portion of project has been completed. Waiting on electrical contractor to install conduit in tree wells in order to backfill with topsoil so planting can begin. Have made contact with F & F landscaping to schedule plantings. Waiting on a call back from them to discuss schedule for plantings. Light poles are being delivered early next week plan to work with K and H and install when they arrive. Fixtures for poles have been ordered. Discussion about crosswalk is on tonight's agenda.
- 2) Chesapeake Ave. road project- all work has been completed on this project. Minor item that remains is stripping for parallel parking. Related to this project, DPW staff has been working on Callis Park entrance area. Crew has built entrance wall, installed new drain and backfilled area. Fence contractors are on site and installing new fence around pumping station. Public works crew removed existing fence and fencing contractor is scheduled to install new fence next week.
- 3) Environmental Concerns has resumed work on the berm project. Crew is installing base on east side of pond this week.
- 4) DPW assisted landscape contractor on prepping flower beds along Bay Ave for plant the town. Installed two dump truck loads of top soil leave pro mix. Repaired leaks in sprinkler system.
- 5) Water tower painting is going along well. We have had a couple of interruptions in water service for a very short time period. (Less than 15 minutes). Painted should be completed next week.

- 6) DPW crew has been painting stop bars at all stop signs throughout town to try and help with problems of running stop signs etc.
- 7) DPW crew has started repainting of the sea wall located on Atlantic Ave. Working on this when time and weather permits.
- 8) Held a progress meeting at town hall today on 261 raising project. Will give details tonight.

The following is the status of activities that are being worked on:

Living Shoreline Project & Flood Dike project

Environmental Concerns predicts that they will be substantially complete on the Flood Dike by late July or early August pending suitable weather and tides. WE are evaluating drainage improvements to eliminate any trapped water landward of the dike.

Maryland SHA Rt. 261 SHA Upgrade Project.

SHA's environment al and highway design work is progressing. The elevated walkway on the west side is not included in the current State design efforts. SHA recognizes that the potential for the Town to build this walkway sts. Efforts by the Town to apply for grant funding for the walkway are planned for the mid May of 2017. SHA will conduct a design progress meeting on May 11th, Information from this meeting will be included in my report to Council at their May 11, 2017 meeting.

Beach Dredge Project

, We are continuing with the Federal & State permit process before work can start,

Pier Pavilion Project

We now have the recommended changes to our Critical Area Ordinance that need to be adopted by the Town before we can apply for MDE permits for a 1,000 s.f. pavilion on the north side of the pier tee section.

Critical Area Requirements

I met with the Critical Area Commission Staff on April 6 to discuss the need for legislation to be approved by the Council for the Town's Critical Area Program. The legislative items include the following:

- 1. Reflect that the Burnt Oaks Project was elevated from its original Classification of Limited Development Area (LDA) to Intensely Developed Area (IDA) when it was built in the 1990's The need for this item became known as part of the new Critical Area maps (Item 2).
- 2. Reflect the new Critical Area maps that were provided to the Town by DNR in 2014.
- 3. Adjust the requirements in Town Zoning to meet current State mandated Critical Area requirements.
- 4. Adjust the requirements in Town Critical Area Zoning to allow for the installation of the proposed Pavilion on the Town Pier.

Critical Area staff has now provided model language for modifying the Town Critical Area Ordinance, To do this an Ordinance introduction is being scheduled for the May 11, 2017 Town Council meeting.


