WHEN THE LEAVES START TO FALL



Fall means beautiful foliage colors, but with this comes falling leaves. Keep your gutters and downspouts clear to protect from possible water damage around your home. Please bag or haul away all leaves and yard debris. This will keep debris out of the storm drain collection system and ensure the water flows properly. Once leaves and debris enter the underground piping system, it is very difficult and expensive to remove this type of material. Bagged leaves can be placed with household trash for pick up on Mondays and Fridays.
