WINTER Readiness

- Heating System Maintenance: Schedule a professional inspection and replace filters
 regularly to ensure efficient operation. During a snow event, check the blades of your heat
 pump because the blades cannot withstand a lot of weight from heavy snow. Turn off the
 unit and clear the blades to ensure it is working properly.
- Chimney and Fireplace Inspection: If you have a fireplace, have the chimney inspected and cleaned to prevent fire hazards. Make sure the damper is working properly.
- Gutter Cleaning: Clear gutters of leaves and debris to prevent ice dams, which can cause water damage to your home.
- Outdoor Faucets: Turn off and drain outdoor water faucets to prevent pipes from freezing and bursting.
- Emergency Kit: Prepare an emergency kit with essentials like blankets, flashlights, batteries, non-perishable food, and necessary medications.
- Snow Removal Equipment: Have snow shovels, ice melt, and a snow blower available to keep pathways and driveways clear to prevent slips and falls.
- Vehicle Check: Ensure your car is winter-ready by checking the tires, brakes, antifreeze levels, and keeping an emergency kit in the trunk.
