Subject: Monthly Report

The following is a list of items the Public Works Department has been working on in addition to routine task.

- 1) Completed the upgrade of the Bay Ave sewer pumping station. The station is now equipped with two new three phase power submersible pumps, which are more efficient and easier to maintain. New piping that replaced the old station piping that was originally installed in the early 1950's. The station is now also equipped with a diesel backup pump that can handle the daily flow in case of emergencies. This pump can also operate in normal conditions if needed. Most of the work for this upgrade was done in house, with the help of a few local contractors. This resulted in a significant cost savings for the Town.
- 2) Work continues on the pier project, contractor is current working on the tee section of the pier and is shooting for a completion date for mid May. Lighting has been ordered and all work related to wiring of the lighting has been completed that can be done in advance of fixtures being installed. Work expected to start soon on railing and bench installation.
- 3) DPW built an addition to welcome center shed to provide more storage for beach and pier related items.
- 4) Work is picking up on the park site weather permitting. DPW started on installation of site utilities, which include storm water system and water line for park. K and H electric started on underground electric site work. Knee Deep pond's is working on punch list to finish up their pond contract. Plants to be installed in the pond in the next couple weeks are also part of the work to be performed. Have a meeting set up with concrete contractor for Friday to go over sidewalk construction.
- 5) Currently working with John Hoffman on solutions for 7<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> street storm water flooding issues. In the process of scheduling cleaning of storm drain pipes in this area as soon as this month in order to do a inspection of current system.
- 6) Continued to work with Ms. Ginny Siemer from Maryland Rural Water and have come up with a Emergency Response Plan for the Towns water system. This was a request from our water compliance inspector from MDE and is intended to be a hands on guide

for staff to follow in the event of emergency situations the may arise that related to the Public Water System.

The following is the status of activities that are being worked on:

#### USACOE Wetland Revitalization Project

The Corps representative has been out on personal leave for the past few weeks so I am not able to provide a current update on status.

### th Street Flood Mitigation & Living Shoreline Projects

The Board of Public Works is now schedule to approve the State Wetlands License for the Living Shoreline Prioject on April 15<sup>th</sup>. Once that approval has been made, MDE will issue the permit for the Flood Dike and Calvert County will approve the grading permit for both projects. Environmental Concerns will them start physical work which is now scheduled for the first week in May.

#### New Fishing Platform and Renovations for Town Pier.

Work is progressing on the lower fishing platform and decking. We anticipate substantial completion by early May.

#### Zoning Ordinance & Map

The Planning Commission continues their work on the draft Ordinance. There will be a work session on Saturday April 11<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Bay Front Park**

Work on the water feature is 98 % complete. Preparations are underway to begin walkway construction sand final grading. .

#### **Drainage & Roadway Projects**

We are working on a design for a project to improve the drainage on the east side of Erie Ave. between First & Second Streets in addition developing cost estimates and preliminary plans for capital projects to be considered in the next Town budget cycle.

We are also working on the design for Storm drain out fall Improvements at both 9<sup>th</sup> St and 7th Street in the vicinity of Atlantic Ave.

#### Maryland SHA Rt. 261 Upgrade Project.

SHA has schedule a progress meeting on their feasibility Study for April 14<sup>th</sup>. I will provide a report on what is learned at this meeting.

#### Solar Panel Project DPW Shop Building.

We are waiting for the Maryland Energy Administration approval before starting the work under the Contract with Solar Tech that Council approved at their March meeting.
