Re: Bid & Award Contract for Fishing Platform, Breakwater & Pier Renovations

On August 10, 2013 the Town received 4 bids for the Contract for the subject project. Attachment No. 1 is a summary of the bids received.

To assist in your review the following items are included in the different bid items:

Base Bid - All work for the 6' approach walkway, fishing platform, pile repairs in the tee section and the stone breakwater. (This item does not include any new decking on the pier or tee section of the pier).

Add Alternate No. 1 This item includes the piling repairs needed for the pier landward of the Tee Section.

Add Alternate No. 2 This item includes the removal of all decking on the pierand tee and replacing with wood.

Add Alternate No. 3 This item includes the removal of all decking on the pier and tee and replacing with composite decking..

At minimum the project should include the Base Bid work plus Add Alternate No. 1(piling repair for the pier).

Attachment No. 2 also shows what the bid results would be for three differ scenarios using the add alternate bids received from each bidder.

Subsequent to the bid opening the Town was notified of the following:

- 1. There is an error in the Crandell bid for Add Alternates No. 2& 3
- 2. There is an error in the Dissen & Juhn bid for Add Alternate No. 3.

Upon examining the bids, staff determined that with the amount of State funding and the cost of the potential contracts exceeding \$500,000, that the Contractors would need to comply with the prevailing wage requirements in State laws governing the grant funding to be received by the Town.

Each Bidder was contacted on the prevailing wage requirements and responded as follows:

E.A. & J. O. Crandell - The wage rates they pay have complied with the minimum rates on other projects.

Dissen & Juhn - Their bid would increase by the following amounts; Base Bid \$41,000; Al.t #1 \$5,000; Alt. No. 2 \$6,000 & Alt. No. 3 \$6,000.

SE Davis - Their Bid prices are based on using prevailing wage rates.

Comman Marine - Corman pays prevailing wages but they are not sure about their subcontractor

Attachment No. 2 shows the impact to the Dissen & Juhn Bid if their pricing were to be adjusted for the inclusion of the minimum prevailing wage requirement.

The above results in the following bid results for Dissen & Juhn and SE Davis. I have excluded the bids from Corman and Crandell as they are higher than the Davis and Dissen & Juhn bids.

Base bid + Add Alternate 1 (minimum project)

Dissen & Juhn S519,283

SE Davis \$ 494,795

Base Bid +Add Alternates 1&2 (minimum project plus wood decking.)

Dissen & Juhn \$596,015

SE Davis \$567,627

Base Bid +Add Alternates 1&3 (minimum project plus composite decking.)

Dissen & Julin N.A error in bid for composite decking

SE Davis \$707,543.00

The best price for the minimum project and wood decking was provided by SE Davis at \$567,627.

If the Town chooses to use the composite decking, the cost of the SE Davis bid increases to \$707.543 an increase of \$139,916. In all probability the difference could be even greater as we may have to install additional framing to the pier in order to achieve the required deck load capability using composite decking needed for the planned use of the pier.

a) John Flynn: 3725 Bedford Drive; Mr. Flynn would like to know the types of structured envisioned on the property. Mr. Hofmann stated this was a zoning change request and not a request to review any type of building plans.

Pat Haddon, Planning Commission co-chair moved to recommend this rezoning be approved, as the Planning Commission has reviewed it and has found it to be consistent, as required by the Land Use Article of the Maryland Annotate Code, with the North Beach Comprehensive Plan, and per the letter sent by the Planning Commission to the Mayor and Town Council in September 2013. After a discussion on the use of wood or composite it was determined to move the approval of the contract to the January 2014 Town Council meeting after further discussion on the material to be used.

- 1) Started and completed retaining wall, steps and walkway that provides access to 7th street from town parking lot. Work that remains is cleanup and landscaping along walkway and two sections of fencing.
- 2) Have been working with Shore Scan, a firm that specializes in scanning blueprints and drawings. We are going thru all as built plans and scanning so we will have electronic copies saved on file.
- 3) Continuing to work with John Hoffman and town staff on several projects, which will be updated tonight.
- 4) Had a snow and ice event on 1-2-14 ,DPW staff came in at 9:00 pm and started spreading salt. Staff continued plowing throughout the night and had roads clear by 4:30 am. Spread another layer of salt for morning rush hour.

Happy New Year to everyone

Due to my full time position at WSSC/Louis Berger Group I will be unable to attend Town meeting this month. Thank you.

Dec. 12, 2013 –January 9,2014

Pending issues;

Property clean up on Bay Ave.: Hazardous Abatement was performed on Saturday 12/14/2013. Deputy cancelled at last minute but there were no problems during abatement. Looks good over there now.

Donnie Bowen's crew in Public Works will be performing the Hazardous Abatement on the Town's property in the wooded area adjacent to wetlands on 10th St. when time permits and before things get green again. Thanks again to them ahead of time.

Abandoned/Foreclosed properties: Haven't yet had a chance to follow up on any of them this year. But when time permits I'll check the statuses of them all to see if there are any changes from last year. Several that had been an issue for many years are now with new owners and are looking good. Let's hope that that trend will continue.

Unregistered vehicle on 8th St. mentioned in last month's report was tagged by County Deputy with threat of impound and was moved from Right Of Way by owner. An unregistered utility trailer that was on corner of 8^{th St.} and Erie Ave. was posted by me with threat of tow and was removed from Right Of Way by owner. An unregistered vehicle on 6th St. and Erie Ave. was removed by owner after a verbal warning from me. Another unregistered vehicle on 6th St. and Erie Ave. was posted by me and will be moved off of Right Of Way by owner after a verbal warning from me along with posting. Will be moved this coming weekend per owner or it will be towed. The Town Hall staff has been talking to Chip's Towing to try to work out an agreement for towing as a last resort. Chip's Towing is currently checking out any legal concerns on their end before getting back to us. Currently ongoing.

Illegal dumping: Town Hall staff is also investigating portable covert surveillance to catch perpetrators of illegal dumping on Town Right Of Ways. It's taken some time because searching for surveillance equipment that fits our needs. So we reached out to the professionals and I believe our issue has been resolved. Will find out this week or next. Currently ongoing. Better to take the time to make sure we get what we need the first time.

Citizen complaints this past month were about various trash incidents, unregistered vehicles in Town right of ways and chickens. Currently working on a property on 8th St. where chickens are being kept. Will keep you posted.

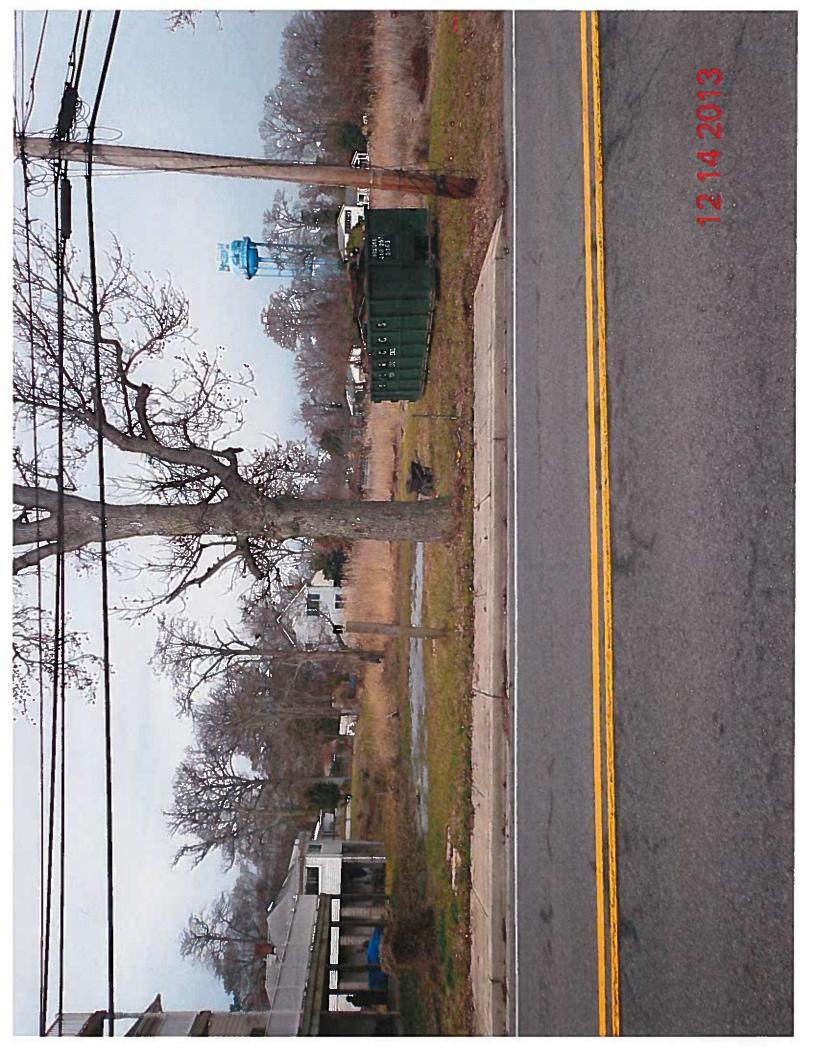
Hot button issues: unregistered vehicles, basketball hoops still, utility trailers in right of ways (registered and unregistered), fences in alleys and that divide properties, backyard maintenance, illegal dumping, bulk pickup items put out days/weeks too early

Rental inspections for rental licenses are ongoing as well as business license inspections. All licenses issued are posted on ShoreScan now. There are a couple of rental properties that failed inspection and re-inspection is pending per work needed being completed.

The following is the status of activities that are being worked on:

Wetland Revitalization Project & SHA MD Rt. 261 improvements

The mayor and Town staff are meeting with both SHA and the Corps of Engineers on Friday January 10th to discus schedules and design coordination for both projects,

Boat Slip Dredge

The Town submitted a request for waterway Improvement funding from DNR the first week in August. The next step is to work on the agreement with Chesapeake Beach on the use of their disposal site and continue to pursue federal & State permits. We will be meeting this month with Chesapeake Beach to determine where the North Beach dredge material will be placed in their disposal site.

9th Street Flood Mitigation Project

Two properties have not approved their easement agreements We are working on the details of the agreement with both and expect their approval in the near future. We are continuing to work with the federal and state permitting agencies on the tidal wetland permits.

New Fishing Platform and Renovations for Town Pier.

Bids for the Fishing Platform, Breakwater and Pier Renovations including new decking were received on December 10, 2013. The award of a contract is on your January Town council agenda. .

Block 4 Parking Lot

A new plan for the walkway to 7th St. has been developed and we are working with Mr. Russo on the easement for the revised location. Mr. Russo is obtaining the concurrence of the USPS which leases the parcel over which the walkway easement is located.

Pier upgrade project

The County permit has been issued for the Welcome Center. The Town has entered into trade contracts and Public Works is starting their work on the project. We are preparing bid documents for new pier lighting.

3rd Street Park

CPH has provided pre-final drawings and specification and a updated cost estimate. These items are to be discussed at your January Council meeting.

Zoning Ordinance & Map

The Planning commission is working on drafting changes to the Zoning ordinance and Map to be recommended to Town council. The Commission is working on a draft a work plan to recommend to Town Council to develop a master plan for the Central Business District area of the Town.

Drainage Projects

A design is being developed for a storm drain from 9th & Bay to Chesapeake Ave. between 8th & 9th Streets to eliminate a drainage problem on Chesapeake Ave. and also for a project to improve the drainage on the east side of Erie Ave. between First & Second Streets.

ORDINANCE	NO.	13-11

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE ZONING MAP OF THE TOWN OF NORTH BEACH, MARYLAND BY REZONING THREE PROPERTIES IN BLOCK 5 OF THE TOWN OF NORTH BEACH OWNED BY RAR ASSOCIATES DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION FROM THEIR EXISTING ZONING DESIGNATION TO THE C-2 ZONING DESIGNATION.

WHEREAS, on November 7, 2008 RAR Associates Development Corporation, hereinafter referred to as "RAR", filed an application with the Town Zoning Administrator pursuant to Section 117-29(a)(3) of the Town Zoning Ordinance to change the designation of three properties located on block 5 of the Town of North Beach; and

WHEREAS, specifically, those properties are shown, and described, on a plat attached to this Ordinance as Exhibit 1. They are Lot E, Block 5 which is currently zoned C-1. P-301, Block 5, currently zoned R-1 and S-1/2 4, Block 5 currently zoned R-1; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Town of North Beach, Maryland, passed a new comprehensive plan on August 9, 2012, which designated the area in and around Lot 5 as an area where commercial development should take place; and

WHEREAS, C-1 zoning within the Town of North Beach is a light commercial zone and R-1 Zoning is a purely residential zone. C-2 is the most dense commercial zone allowed by the Town of North Beach Zoning Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission of the Town of North Beach first met on this proposal on September 26, 2010 and recommended approval to the Town Council. Subsequently, on August 19, 2010, the Mayor and Council of the Town of North Beach held a public hearing and heard a presentation from RAR Associates on why the property should be re-zoned to the C-2 zone; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council never acted on the application after the 2010 hearing because at that time, a new required comprehensive plan had not yet been adopted and therefore, no individual re-zonings could take place; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the August 9, 2012 adoption of the new comprehensive plan, the Planning Commission re-convened on this case on September 26, 2013 and once again, recommended approval to the Town Council; and

WHEREAS, on November 7, 2013, at a duly advertised and scheduled public hearing, the Mayor and Town Council once again heard from RAR Associates in support of the re-zoning. Subsequent to the presentation, the Mayor and Council by majority vote approved the re-zoning application and directed that this Ordinance be drafted to effectuate the zoning change; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Town of North Beach Zoning Code, the Town Council and the

Town Planning Commission held a joint public hearing on December 12, 2013 to consider this Ordinance. At that time, the Planning Commission and the Town Council held separate votes, both of which approved the application.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of North Beach, Maryland that the property described on Exhibit 1 to this Ordinance, specifically Lot E, Block 5; P-03, Block 5 and S ½ 4, Block 5, each be re-designated from their current zoning designations to the C-2 zoning designation on the Town of North Beach zoning map. In making this zoning change, the Mayor and Town Council specifically find the following based on evidence adduced at the November 7, 2013 hearing:

- 1. That there has not been significant population change in the area of the re-zoning or in the Town that would materially affect the decision to re-zone these properties.
- 2. That the Mayor and Town Council find as a fact that there are adequate public facilities available in the Town to accommodate the re-designation of these properties to the C-2 zone. These public facilities include but are not limited to fire and rescue services, police services, adequate roadways and adequate water and sewer systems to serve the area.
- 3. The Mayor and Town Council specifically find that re-zoning to the C-2 designation would be compatible with current and future transportation patterns. There are adequate roadways serving the area. In addition, the Town has recently purchased property in order to improve the overall parking situation within the Town of North Beach.
- 4. That the Mayor and Town Council find as a fact that the Planning Commission, through their letter of September 26, 2013, recommends that the Town Council re-designate these properties to the C-2 designation.
- 5. That the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of North Beach find as a fact that rezoning these properties to the C-2 designation is entirely consistent with the current comprehensive plan of the Town of North Beach which calls for commercial development in the area of Block 5.
- 6. That the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of North Beach, based on evidence adduced at the November 7, 2013 public hearing find that this property should be re-designated to the C-2 zone because there was a mistake in the existing zoning classification and the property should have previously been designated to the C-2 zoning. This is based upon a review of the 1998 North Beach Comprehensive Plan and a review of the Proposed Comprehensive Plan dated April 12, 2010 and the current Comprehensive Plan dated August 9, 2012; all of those planning documents recommended that the area of Block 5 should be an area of commercial development within the Town of North Beach. Therefore, it was a mistake for these properties not to have been re-designated to the C-2 commercial zone in the last comprehensive re-zoning in 2005. As part of this finding, the Mayor and Council of the Town of North Beach hereby incorporate and make a part of this Ordinance the written arguments advanced by RAR which were entered into the record on November 7, 2013 as an Exhibit.

AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of North Beach that this Ordinance is hereby adopted this 12th day of December, 2013, and will become effective on the 22nd day of December, 2013, which is ten (10) days after the joint public hearing of the Mayor and Town Council and the Planning Commission in the regards to this rezoning.
