#### Minutes from the May 5, 2016

#### Work Session

Attendance: Mayor Frazer, Mike Benton, Jane Hagen, Ken Wilcox, Mickey Hummel, Randy Hummel, Gwen Schiada, John Shay, Donnie Bowen, Joanne Hunt, Dawn Richardson, Rick Crump and Stacy Wilkerson.

- Swearing In of new Councilmember Jane Hagen: Councilmember Jane Hagen was chosen by fellow councilmember at the April Council Meeting. Mayor Frazer swore Jane Hagen in to fill the term vacated by Greg McNeill.
- 2) Scheduled appointment with San Francisco by the Bay Board of Director Members (trash containers) San Francisco by the Bay Board Members have very small yards and some townhomes are constructed on inclines with back yards that are not accessible easily for trash can storage. The North Beach Zoning Ordinance states that trash cans in multi dwelling units must be screened from view. The Board of Directors are requesting a waiver from this particular article from the Town. Some residents in this community without garages store their trash cans on their front porches since they are not able to reach their back yards easily. Town Attorney John Shay will look at the particular section in reference and will give an opinion on the Section and what the Town can do to accommodate the request. Also, in attendance was the Burnt Oaks Development Board Member asking for assistance from the Town to enforce the current trash policy of screening the trash cans and bringing them in after the trash in collected on Mondays and Friday.
- 3) Award of Boat Slip Dredging: The Two received two bids to dredge the transient boat slips. The Staff has reviewed the bids and makes the following recommendations: Award a contract in the amount of \$174, 431 to Dissen & Juhn which is the amount of then bid using the 2.350 c.y dredge amount; and approve a contract to Crandell firm for the use of the Shady side disposal site at a price of \$20 per c.y for a total amount of \$47,000. MOTION made by Randy Hummel to approve the contracts as recommended by the staff. Seconded by Gwen Schiada. All in favor. Motion carries.
- 4) Kayak Launch Proposal: John Hofmann and Donnie Bowen provided a staff memo and recommendation to not proceed with a kayak launch ramp at the end of the pier. Extensive work and research has been done with companies and Jeff Noyes and a solution has not been found for the pier. They will continue to work for the pier.
- 5) Walton Beach Nature Preserve Recommendations: The Environmental Committee presented a power point on their recommendations for Walton Beach. These recommendations will be an attachment "A" to these minutes. At the July Work Session, the recommendation will be discussed.
- 6) North Beach Volunteer Committee Discussion: Mayor Frazer made a recommendation to merge the volunteer committees together into one. The committee combining would be Environmental, Special Events and Economic Development. Several members from each committee were in attendance at the

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meeting along with their liaisons. The members that spoke at the meeting were not interested in combining into one committee. They would like to stay as individual committees. The Economic Development Committee did request a new liaison since Greg McNeil resigned. Mayor Frazer advised someone would be appointed to him.

7) FY 17 Budget Discussion: Joanne Hunt highlighted on the fy17 budget. A public hearing on the budget will be held on Thursday, May 12, 2016.

The following is a list of task the Public Works department has been working on in addition to routine task.

- 1) Worked with Master Gardener's group with items on the Sunrise Garden Park to meet all criteria for the park to become Bay Wise certified.
- 2) Dayton Avenue sidewalk project. Not much activity has taken place due to weather. Concrete crew was back on site 5-11-16 to continue with project. Started on curb on east side of Dayton and finishing tie in of homeowner's sidewalk to new town right of way.
- 3) Have been working with CPH on streetscape conceptual study, they are planning on being at the June work session with a presentation for Mayor and council.
- 4) On 5-2-2016 the area experienced severe storms in the afternoon which dumped 3 inches of rain in a short period of time. This caused flooding in the usual areas on Chesapeake, Bay and 5<sup>th</sup> street. The storm also caused related problems at sewer pump stations. The backup pump on the beach ran from 7:30 pm Monday evening until 2:15 am Tuesday morning. Cleanup of the area was done on Tuesday.
- 5) On 5-6-2016 the town experienced flooding in the ninth street area related to high tides street flooded on both high tide cycles. Clean up was done the following day.
- 6) DPW met with sales representative for the flood signs and has started installation of the solar powered flood signs. Installation should be completed next week.
- 7) Continuing to work with Mr. Hoffman and Environmental Committee members on solution for Kayak launch possibilities.

8) Mark Dougherty and I attended Maryland Rural water conference. We attended several classes related to water and sewer operations. There were several venders there which related to Public Work operations.

The following is the status of activities that are being worked on:

#### Flood Dike & Living Shoreline Projects

Construction for the Living Shoreline is substantially complete Environmental Concerns will return to the site in the Spring to reestablish any plantings that do not survive the winter months. Gene Slear informed us physical work would restart week of 5/9 EC is working on review of the dike revisions with MDE. Except for two properties, the revised easements for the Flood Dike are in place. Gene Slear and I are working to get the final two revised easements.

#### Maryland SHA Rt. 261 SHA Upgrade Project.

SHA is preparing a response to the Town's request for a higher roadway grade and more culvert work to help with improving the wetlands on the west side. We are scheduled to have a conference call with SHA on May 13<sup>th</sup> to review their design progress and the Town's efforts to get grants for a walkway on the west side and possibly the new south culvert.

#### Transient Slip Dredge Project.

A preconstruction meeting is scheduled with Dissen and Juhn for week of May 16th.

#### Beach Dredge Project

We will be applying for a new permit so the area can be dredged next winter and the sand that is removed from the waterway can be used for beach fill.

## Roof Canopy for Pier tee Section

We are preparing materials for a permit pre-application meeting with the Federal & State permitting agencies.


