In September of 2018, the Sheriff's Office handled 156 calls for service in North Beach. This is down from the 166 calls in August 2018.

Subject: Monthly Report

The following is a list of items the Public Works Department has been working on in addition to routine task.

- 1) Had on site meeting with BG & E about relocating of electrical service for upgrade of the towns well house project. This is one of the first steps in upgrade project. Public Works is working on getting major items completed by outside vendors in order to minimize down time for the well.
- 2) Performed routine flushing of town water system. While flushing the system noticed several hydrants needed repainting. Have started repainting all hydrants in the system. In addition addressing any maintenance issues found while operating the hydrants for flushing.
- 3) DPW crew will be removing outdated equipment at the Callis Park in the next few days in order for phase two of new renovations to the park area to be completed. Work is scheduled to begin on renovations in the next week or two.
- 4) DPW crew assisted beach patrol with the cleanup of the beach area with several large trees, driftwood, and debris that had washed up on the beach from all the rain and high tides experienced in the past few weeks.
- 5) Have continued to work with Calvert County Water and Sewer Department in getting them to smoke test their sewer collection system which flows to the town's sewer collection system. This would allow them to find and hopefully correct infiltration problems they may have. This would greatly reduce storm water from entering the sewer system. I have been told this has been scheduled to happen in the coming weeks.
- 6) DPW has started to address alley in town, several need attention after all the wet weather we have had over the past few months.

- 7) Crosswalk Border payment request-There still is an outstanding balance that remains on the crosswalk project. The contractor, Mr. Woodburn and I have met to discuss the problem with the white borders that outline the crosswalks. It was relayed to the contractor at that site meeting that the town was not happy with the appearance of the borders even after an attempt was made by the contractor to repair several problems with the appearance. Our position at this time is they never have been installed as per contract specs and have not been accepted. The contractor has offered to reduce the amount of final invoice from \$20,000.00 to \$15,500. Would like to have councils input on a resolution to this problem. (counter offer etc.)

The following is the status of activities that are being worked on:

Maryland SHA Rte. 261 SHA Upgrade Project (9th Street to Anne Arundel County)

SHA's environmental and highway design work is progressing toward a planned construction start for the spring of 2020. The SHA held a design update meeting in June to discuss design progress. Most of the meeting revolved around the Maryland Department of Transportation Town hall Meeting held on June 21, 2018. The main topic included the proposed detour during Construction. A resolution by the town is being requested to be forwarded to the Maryland Department of Transportation secretary Peter Rahn to show Town support for the project and request existing pole utilities be placed underground. A follow up meeting was held July 25, 2018 at the SHA offices in Annapolis. Further discussion was held regarding concerns from a few citizens regarding closure of the Road for 9-12 months duration the construction project. With closure, the construction time will extend to a 2+ year project and costs will escalate significantly. The SHA informed us that they believe adequate police, fire and rescue and EMS coverage was available if a road closure were to occur. The final decision has been moved up the chain to the district engineer. (As of October 11, 2018 a decision has not been made). Design Drawings at 65% level are expected this month.

Maryland SHA Rte. 261 Boardwalk (9th Street to Anne Arundel County)

Preliminary design is complete and TAP (Transportation Alternatives Program) grant Monies will be sought for 2018. The Town has prepared a new grant package to the state this month. No new update. An official Town resolution has been sent to SHA to have them include provisions for the boardwalk and underground utilities as part of their 261 upgrade project.

Stormwater Flood Pump Upgrade and 9th & Atlantic upgrades:

The existing stormwater pump station is not designed to adequately handle frequent localized flooding. We have begun to analyze the system and provide upgrade proposals for consideration and to request monies to be budgeted in the coming fiscal year and to (100K) we are looking at possible grant opportunities.

Flood Mitigation Plan:

Calvert County Department of planning and Zoning issued a flood mitigation plan for the town of North Beach. The plan is a guide that outlines flood issues and sea rise issues in the Town along with potential mitigation consideration for current conditions and into the year 2100. Nine (9) recommendations came out of the study, many of which are or have already been implemented.

Public Works Yard – Well Building

We prepared a preliminary engineering construction budget to upgrade and raise the existing 30+ year old well house building. Design is underway. We are meeting with BGE to discuss relocation of the existing electric service and meter out of the well building and into the shop.

Storm Drain System Maintenance:

We are working with Donnie and public works to develop a storm drainage maintenance and improvement plan for Fy 18 and Fy 19. Ongoing.

Sewer Meter/ Calvert County Connections:

Calvert County sewage effluent mixes with the town effluent before being pumped together to the Waste Water Reclamation Facility in Chesapeake Beach. We have provided the county with our updated EDU analysis. We are also sending a letter to the County encouraging them to do a smoke test on their system to ensure there are limited infiltration points within their system.

Library Site:

We have prepared a new Library Site Concept Plan which has been provided to the County. A new Memorandum of understanding to move the project forward will be prepared behind.

North Town Water Service Franchise Area:

We have planned (attached) a new franchise designation plan to accompany a request to Calvert County to revise the water service limits.

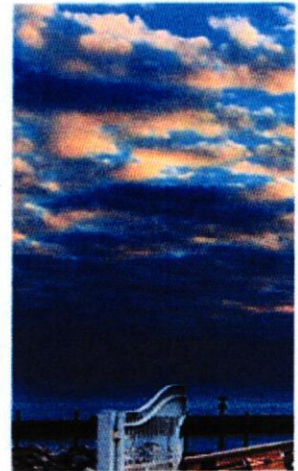

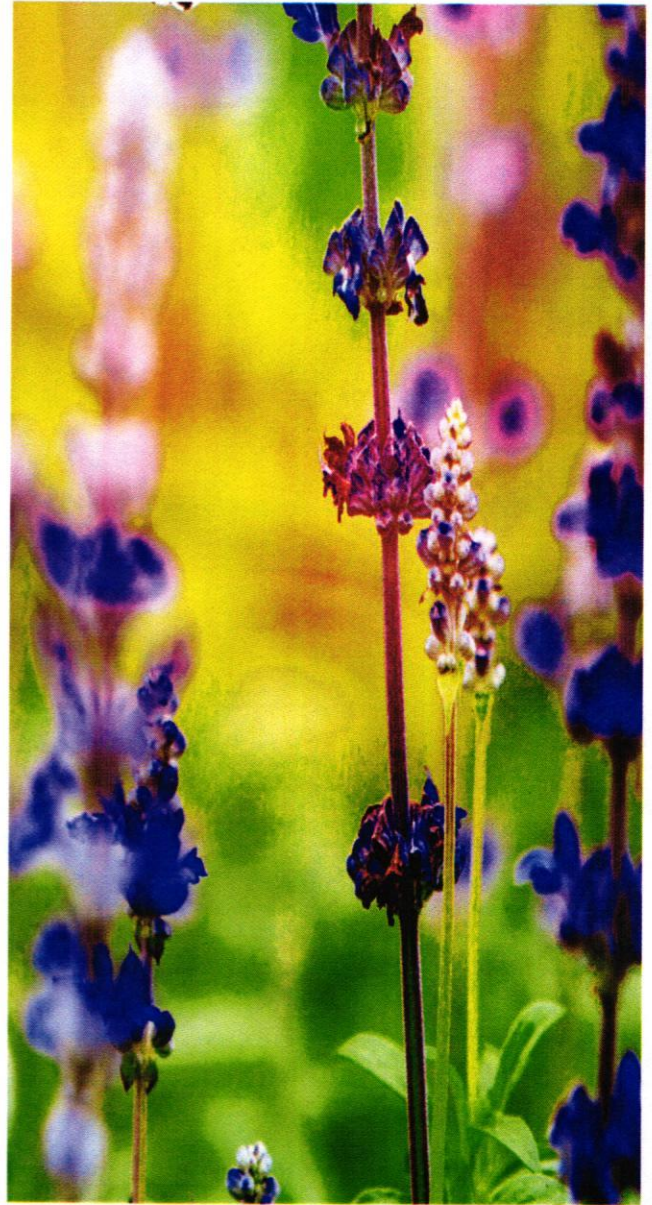
