The following is a list of items the Public Works Department has addressed for this report period.

- 1) Completed the Sunrise Garden project and had the ribbon cutting ceremony for the project.
- 2) Finished painting the remaining crosswalks in town that needed to be painted. Touched up stop bars in throughout town. Repainted curb in front of Town Hall.
- 3) Had Precision Concrete come down and take a look at sidewalks in town. They have given an estimate to saw cut and correct areas where trip hazards exist, without having to remove sidewalk and replace. Contractor has did an area to give us a look at the finished product after saw cutting was done located at the corner of 2<sup>nd</sup> and Chesapeake.
- 4) Removed and replaced last section of boardwalk that had not been replaced as part of contract. Completes entire pier section as being replaced.
- 5) Continued to monitor progress on Living Shore Line project. Contractor has completed installation of rock and back filled with sand. Plantings expected to take place this week. Project will be close to completion of this phase. Work is expected to begin on flood dike in the next week or so.
- 6) Continuing to work with Mr. Hoffman on 7<sup>th</sup> street storm drain and Frederick Ave storm drain improvements.

The following is the status of activities that are being worked on:

## **USACOE** Wetland Revitalization Project

The Corps has not completed the preparation of their design effort plan for Town approval.. We are working with the COE and SHA to get both agencies to coordinate their engineering efforts.

## 9th Street Flood Mitigation & Living Shoreline Projects

Construction is proceeding for the Living Shoreline. The rock sill is 100% complete and EC is proceeding with the marsh plantings asnd the new channel to the tidal pond through the existing breakwater. Construction on the flood Dike is scheduled to start by mid September.

#### New Fishing Platform and Renovations for Town Pier.

Work under the Sue Davis Construction Contract is for the most part completed. Don Bowen & I are working on a final punch list and close out items for the Contract.

#### Zoning Ordinance & Map

The Planning Commission continues their work on the draft Ordinance. After the receipt of the final CPAT report, the Commission will finish the draft Ordinance and present it to Town Council prior to scheduling any public hearings.

#### **Drainage & Roadway Projects**

Design is underway for the Dayton Ave and Frederick Ave projects as outlined in my August 5<sup>th</sup> memo to Town Council. The current Design concept for Dayton Ave 5<sup>th</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> Sts. Includes a

new sidewalk and curb on the west side. The plans for Frederick Ave from 2<sup>nd</sup> St, to 3<sup>rd</sup> St. include drainage (piping and inlets on the east side) and shoulder improvements.

The design for the 7<sup>th</sup> St. Outfall project will move forward after the system is inspected and measured on a forthcoming low tide.

#### Maryland SHA Rt. 261 SHA Upgrade Project.

SHA is continuing to work on the feasibility Study which is scheduled to be completed by the fall of 2015.

### Solar Panel Project DPW Shop Building.

The work by Solar Tech is underway and is now scheduled to be completed by the end of September.

#### Transient Sliop Dredge Project.

We aere completing arrangements for using the Crandell Churchton disposal site and possible an alternate site. Final permit drawings and application will be submitted to MDE and the USACOE during the week of September 14<sup>th</sup>.
